For several months Jusme has been talking with a village pastor to request for HOME to bring VBS to the children in a remote village in the rocky and mountainous terrain outside of Mirbalais.

After months of hearing, "NO," **God softened the heart of the preacher and opened the door of the village church.** Earlier in the week Pastors Jusme and Ribinson took a motorcycle ride to the city of Mirbalais and then walked two hours to reach the village church - a frame of sticks covered with a tarp.

The children waited eagerly to experience God's truths through worship, crafts, and story telling. God's word came alive with new praise songs and words of hope through scriptures.

#### **Thoughts from Ribinson Cherisma**

There were over 120 deported from the Dominican Republic at the Camp of Fond Bayan, Malpasse, Haiti. Trankil, one of the staff of HOME went there at 6:00 AM to meet the leader of that camp and become familiar with the people. And he also got the chance to worship with them.

Our plan was to get there at 1:00 to serve lunch, but we got there at almost 4:00 PM after dealing with 3 broken taptaps. Some said the devil was at work, but we shall not be shaken when Jesus is on board!

The 25 volunteers of HOME had such a wonderful welcome at the refugee camp. We prayed at the tents, in the community, and we worshipped and sang with the refugees. I was astonished to see how everyone sits and wait to get their **food**, **juice**, **hugs**, **and love**. They were so well behaved and patient. Pastor Saintilus Cineas' wife did a great job organizing the distribution.

As far as their needs are concerned, they have been in need of drinking water, but FFP now helps with this. There is still a need for clothes, food, profession, and jobs.

I spoke with different families - one of them has five children and spending **days with no food**. We see that when a truck comes the children run towards it, expecting it bring something for them to eat.

Hearing the stories is difficult. A 19 year old girl already had a baby in the DR and is now pregnant of 7 months. She was deported while she was going to buy something. Every day she goes to the border to look for her husband among the people that they are sending in Haiti. She still can't find her husband, but one day she bumped into her mother also got deported.

Many days are spent looking for lost family members at the border. Two women of gave birth to babies during the month that they came. They are already tired of their condition of living. Their only hope is in the Lord through the Christian families. Some don't speak creole. And some even want to give away their babies because they cannot provide food for them.

As results of our visit we saw refugees smiling and getting better hope because of people that God puts on their way to feed their stomach, mind, spirit and soul. The staff here is already collecting clothes for our next visit. We can't wait. We are thankful to Luke 101 for supporting our visits. And make us evangelize through words and deeds.
