This facility used to be a premier hospital but due to the lack of funding they can not even provide meals for patients; family members must attend to these needs. If you have no family, you are at the mercy of friends or good Samaritans. First Primitive and HOME took on that role during their visit. One man told of how he had been there for 25 days. He was a retired preacher. He had lung problems. They had taken 3 gallons of fluid off of his lungs during the days he was there. He was very malnourished.

PROVIDING SPIRITUAL AND PHYSICAL FOOD

Kids Clubs are being led by HOME Team WISE Bible College graduates who are preparing and writing their own Bible based curriculum!

Each HOME pastor receives \$100 a month to help with the cost of materials, transportation, snacks, and organization of volunteers. Groups visiting on short term mission trips often assist by bringing prizes, craft supplies, and hygiene items for the children. One generous supporter recently donated a new printer for the team so they can make copies for the clubs! Merci!

Being able to provide a meal for the children would be a dream. It is difficult to learn when you are hungry. One young man once told me that when he is hungry his mother tells him to go out and play to take his mind off the hunger.

MOSES STAFF SPOTLIGHT

These two little girls, ages 11 and 13, are attending the Moses Staff Kids club. They can barely write their names. Neither have attended school. They lived in the countryside but lost their father. Their mother is overwhelmed with six children and another on the way. The girls have come to live in the city with relatives. What a huge opportunity this small club has to shine a little light!

It would be powerful if the kids clubs could provide both spiritual and physical food. Just as Jesus fed the people before he taught, our goal is the same.

Clubs can feed each child for about \$1 a each. Do the math!

We have eight clubs meeting with almost 500 children attending each week. It seems a bit overwhelming, but this is our prayer. WHAT WE'RE
