CIY Engage rocked it out in Haiti with big hearts and a big message.

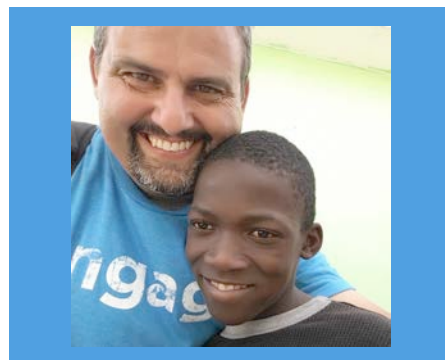

Each family was given two bags filled with rice, oil, beans, and chicken cubes. The idea was to share a bag with a neighbor and use it as a tool to share Christ.

After lunch over 150 children attended a VBS program led by the CIY team. The church provided a beautiful lunch for the team as they had a time for fellowship and prayer with church leaders. What a powerful day!

The CIY team led multiple VBS programs, painted and poured a wall at the Men Nan Men school sponsored by Foundation for Peace, and planted a garden at the CAD orphanage in Ganthier. Tireless Kingdom workers! One of the highlights of the trip was a visit to the aging home in Port au Prince. The HOME team has been building relationships with the patients there by providing devotions, meals, and hygiene kits during their monthly visits. Alexander, a patient we've befriended, asked to be baptized as he surrendered his life completely to Christ. Tears, singing, hugs, dancing, and lots of prayers overflowed that day.

CIY continued to work on their final day in Haiti, prayer walking in the Kwokock community where Pastor Valentine ministers.

It was a joy to share food and prayers with the church and unchurched in the village. CIY will be returning in June and July of 2016.

Teaching Leadership and Value Through Art

One of the important components of kids club is demonstrating how to be productive and responsible even when it seems there is nothing to do. Pastor Ribinson expressed concern, "Since I grew up here I always notice kids and young adults sitting on the walls to talk about soccer and women. That's their free time. It becomes their profession."

Ribinson challenges this bad habit in his Moses Staff Kids Club by teaching art. "Art projects teach the kids to use their talents, to take responsibility, and to know their value. It is their very first time making art so it is not going to be a piece of perfect art, but they deserve encouragement to show them their value."
